FLOAT FLYING RULES

- Spectators must remain in the designated area (for AMA sanctioned events).
- Current AMA license required and must show proof if requested.
- No float flying before 8 AM and after dusk.
- Only 2.4 GHz and 72 MHZ systems will be allowed.
- Mufflers are required for all 2-cycle engines.
- AMA Safety Code must be followed at all times.
- Pilots shall be familiar with the AMA Safety Code and Flying Site Rules as noted above before initiating flight of an aircraft.
- No intentional flying over spectator areas or shoreline.
- Model aircraft must yield to man-carrying aircraft and avoid flying over boaters or other recreational watercraft at all possible. It is recommended that the pilot has a spotter for each flight.
- Retrieval craft (e.g., boat kayak, etc.) must be available at all times to retrieve aircrafts unable to return to shore under their own power.
- No flying is allowed while retrieval craft is operating to retrieve aircraft.
- No powered aircraft may be flown closer than 25 feet to any individual, except during take-off and landing.
- Water landings must be no closer than 15 yards from the shoreline.
- Pilots shall announce intentions during take-off and landing, especially during emergency situation. Pilot shall announce direction of landing if coming in downwind or opposite of traffic pattern.
- Pilots shall be aware of local emergency numbers for the hospital and the police.
