

CRCF FLYING SITE RULES

- AMA Safety Code must always be followed.
- FAA# is required on RC aircraft and up to the pilot to have it displayed on their airplanes and be current with the FAA.
- Current AMA license required and must show proof if requested by Field Marshal.
- NO powered aircraft may be flown closer than 25 feet to any individual, except during take-off and landing, touch and go, and low fly by and must be called out prior.
- NO intentional flying over or at spectator areas or pits.
- NO take-off and landing in the Taxi Area.
- NO flying at or over hangars or care takers living quarters
- NO power flying before 8 AM and after dusk.
- NO pets allowed at flying field for safety of pets and people.
- NO taxiing allowed in the Pit Area.
- NO taxiing behind flight stations.
- NO engine break-in in the Pit Area. Use area south side of mower shed.
- Model aircraft must yield to man-carrying aircraft. it is recommended that the pilot has a spotter for each flight at the field.
- Inexperienced/Novice pilots shall engage the Field Marshall or Intro Pilots for assistance until becoming proficient at unassisted flight (flying solo).
- Pilots shall announce intentions during take-off and landing, especially during emergency landings. Pilot shall announce direction of landing if coming in downwind or opposite of traffic pattern.
- Only pilots and assistants are allowed in pit area.
- Spectators must remain in the designated area.
- Use of field is restricted to active club members and invited guests.
- Invited guests are entitled to use of the Flying Site for 2 days per year provided they are with a member in good standing, after which they would need to become a member.
- 2.4 GHZ preferred.72 MHZ systems will be allowed with use of frequency board located in hanger.
- Pilots shall be aware of local emergency numbers for the hospital and the police.
- Pilots shall be familiar with the AMA safety Code and Flying Site Rules as noted above before initiating flight of an aircraft.
- All crashes east of the fence line and extending south to end of airport, regardless of cause, are to be reported to the Field Marshal ASAP.
- Any crash involving striking and/or damaging private property (hangars, vehicles and/or planes) or injuring a person MUST be reported immediately to the Field Marshal so an investigation can be done and proper persons and or authorities can be notified.
- Smoking is only allowed in designated area (in your vehicle and not within 50 feet of hangars).
- Members and guests shall not litter at the field.
- During the dry summer months and during fire danger the fire cart must be out of the shed and present at the edge of the runway.
